**EXPLORATION UPDATE**

The Company is pleased to announce the start of exploration at two of the companies projects located in Guyana.

**Five Stars Project**

The Guyana Geology and Mines Commission ( GGMC ) has advised the owner of the Five Stars Project, that a field crew has begun work at the site. The GGMC sponsored program will involve stream sediment and auger sampling of the project. The objective of the program is to confirm and expand upon the known gold in soil zones. Gold Port will review the results of this program and identify potential drill targets.

**Akaiwong Project**

The Company has begun site preparation at the Akaiwong Project. Company personnel will re-open the trail system, establish a semi-permanent camp facility and core shack in preparation for a drill program. A four-wheel drive road from Bartica has now been completed to within four miles of the project. The project will be supervised by Mr. Brian Sucre. Mr. Sucre is the former Commissioner of the GGMC, and has extensive experience with the mining industry of Guyana.
